

## **Pupil Premium allocation, use and impact on attainment**

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or who have been entitled to Free School Meals in the last 6 years (known as Ever 6). A premium is also allocated for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility. Schools are, however, accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families.

This document ensures that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the premium and how we have used the premium to support this group of pupils.

The impact on attainment is monitored by Teachers and the Headteacher, reports made to the Governing Body. Alongside this the School Headteacher completes a full audit of accounts to show.

Our aim in spending the Pupil Premium funding is to raise attainment and achievement of pupils to exceed expected progress through:

- 1) Provision to raise literacy and maths levels (Individual and small groups work, ELS, SAIL and Talk Boost, Ili, ELSA and Uplift Maths)
- 2) Providing social and emotional support / interventions (Individual and small group work)
- 3) Enhanced / improved experiences out of school (access to extra-curricular activities is equitable through allocation of specific funding)
- 4) Personalised learning and experiences (access to extra-curricular activities is equitable through allocation of specific funding and individual and small group work)

Outcomes are monitored termly for all pupils and are available on request.
