What is SEN?



To us, a special educational need means any additional or different help/support from that given to other children of the same age.

At Barwick and Stoford CP School, our vision for children and young people with special needs and/or disabilities is the same as for all children and young people – that they achieve well in their early years, at school; are well cared for, have their health needs met, lead happy and fulfilled lives; and have choice and control over the key decisions that affect them.

What is the Local Offer?

From 2014, there was a legal requirement that schools should share the SEN provision that they offer with parents.

Our local offer sets out, in one place, what support and services are available for children with disabilities and special educational needs

What does it look like?

You can expect us to:

- Regularly check your child's progress and , if necessary, update you with any concerns we may have.
- Listen to any concerns you may have about your child's progress or needs they may have during the school day.
- Work with external agencies should the need arise.
- Provide support programmes run by qualified members of staff that are tailored to your child's individual needs.
- Provide the opportunity to speak and liaise with the class teacher or SENDCo (face-to-face, email or phone calls)
- Provide individual learning plans that will contain details of your child's learning programme including activities and targets.
