FOUNDATION CURRICULUM

Geography: We will link our geography knowledge about what settlers need to create an effective settlement

History: We will be learning about the Anglo-Saxon invaders and settlers and the role of the Anglo-Saxon kings such as King Alfred.

Computing: We will be learning to stay safe online and using drawing programs

French: We will be learning vocabulary associated with Greetings, Animals and Seasons

DT: We will be developing our electronic skills by designing a new light.

Arti We are developing our sewing techniques based on the Bayeux Tapestry and Anglo-Saxon art alongside our colour-mixing skills.

Music: We are singing songs based on familiar tunes and stories. We will be learning to sing in different parts.

HOME LEARNING/EXPECTATIONS

There is an expectation that children will be reading every night. Homework will be posted on Seesaw every Friday. This may include spellings or phonics and a Maths activity to complete online and then submit.

RSE
